## The four Bs: enter the research process

Strategies to find information are summed up in the mind map below.

- 1. Go from broad to narrow terms and use some tools such as reference books to find out precise vocabulary
  - Find more background info on your topic using questions: What?, Where?, When?, Who?, Why?
- 2. Gather a bounty of search terms and then choose some to start your actual research in resources
  - Use resources (thesaurus and synonyms dictionaries, CREDO mindmap, ProQuest or Ebscohost subject terms lists) to increase your list of search terms if you don't find answers.
  - Find definitions to be more precise
- 3. Use biographies to find main actors in your research field: specialists, writers, or historical figures...
- 4. Once you choose a document to read, take bibliographical notes to reference information precisely. Your teacher will use them to validate your work. Take bibliographical notes on every document you select and read.

It's easier to erase a useless document with references than trying to find the source afterwards.
