Our Academic Approach

- With an **average of 26 students per class**, our professors know their students well and are committed to their success. They are highly available outside of their teaching hours, providing students with additional support to achieve their goals.
- Students also benefit from **professor-led workshops in several disciplines**, as well as a well-established peer tutoring program.
- Thanks to this focus on their needs, **our students stand out for their academic results**. Last fall, **more than 30% of students appeared on the honour roll** (for an average of 85% or higher).
- **More than 70%** of our students come from francophone high schools.

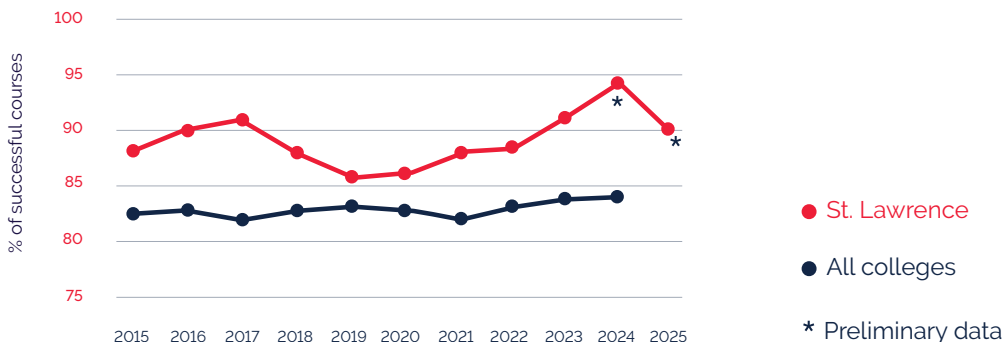

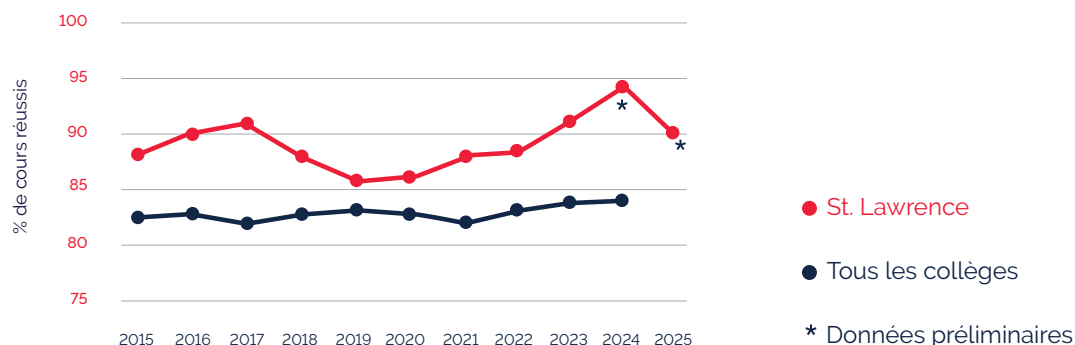

St. Lawrence offers many different opportunities to go abroad during your studies.

Cultural Experience Abroad: Trip to a Foreign Destination

Discover Mexico through classroom learning and international travel. Students explore the country's history, geography, politics, economy, and culture before applying their knowledge during a 12-day educational trip across Mexico. Through visits to historic and cultural sites, interactions with local communities, and guided field experiences, students gain firsthand insight into contemporary Mexican society.

Business Internships Abroad

P.W. Sims Business students can gain valuable international experience through optional internship placements abroad. Students complete a 3-week internship in their second year and a 6-week internship in their third year. In recent years, students have completed internships in countries such as Japan, France, and Switzerland.

British Arts and Literature: There and Back Again

In this course, students explore the places that inspired Britain's greatest writers. Through literature, art, history, and culture, students discover how iconic stories were shaped by the people and places behind them. The course culminates in a 10-day educational trip to England.

Model United Nations Club

Throughout the year, participants attend weekly workshops to prepare them to be a delegate. St. Lawrence attends McMUN, a four-day simulation hosted by McGill University, and NMUN-NY, a week-long simulation held in New York, attended by over 4,000 students from around the world.

Adapted Services

Elite Athlete Services

St. Lawrence offers dedicated academic support for student-athletes competing at an elite level, ensuring they can maintain strong academic performance while pursuing excellence in their sport. Impact of Law 14 on French Language in English Colleges

If you are eligible to attend English school under the Charter of the French Language and are in possession of a certificate granted by the Ministry of Education, you are considered a Certificate Holder. As of Fall 2024, your course sequence will depend on which of the following groups you fall into:

1. Certificate Holders
2. Certificate Holders who are proficient in French
3. Non-Certificate Holders

Our Science program prepares you to succeed in scientific fields at the university level. During your studies, you will have the opportunity to study with highly qualified faculty and work in well-equipped laboratory facilities.

Your Profile

Your choice of profile depends on the admission requirements of the university program to which you wish to apply. All students in this program complete courses in biology, chemistry, physics, and mathematics.

200.B5 Health Science profile

This profile includes courses in Human Physiology and Organic Chemistry. It is intended for students who wish to pursue university studies in the health field and allows students to complete the necessary prerequisites.

200.B6 Pure & Applied Science profile

This profile is oriented toward those who aim to continue their studies at university in a pure and applied program, or who wish to pursue a more general education in the sciences. It allows students a bit more freedom to explore disciplines of their choice, including options such as Advanced Calculus and Astrophysics.

Your Profile

St. Lawrence offers six profiles leading to a DEC in Social Science. All profiles have common elements, but they differ in emphasis and admission requirements. To some extent, the profile that you choose will be determined by the university program that you wish to enter.

300.AD Discovery profile

This profile offers the widest variety of Social Science courses and the greatest flexibility. It is intended for students who wish to explore their options.

300.AP Psychology, Society & Health profile

This profile places an emphasis on studies oriented toward helping professions, such as psychology, social work, counseling, and criminology. It includes courses in Human Biology and Advanced Quantitative Methods, required for admission to psychology programs at Quebec universities. Other courses specific to this profile are Introduction to Sociology and Social Science and Health, as well as a psycho-social second-year course.

300.AW World profile

This profile gives students the opportunity to travel to a foreign destination and discover other social and cultural realities. Other courses specific to this profile are Introduction to Geography and Introduction to Politics, as well as Living in an Intercultural World, a language complementary course, and a second-year course with an international perspective.

300.AJ Social Justice & Leadership profile

This profile focuses on issues of social justice, community engagement, and leadership. An applied course in their final semester gets students involved in the community. Other courses specific to this profile are Introduction to Sociology, Introduction to Politics and a second-year course exploring social justice themes.

400.AM Discovery with Mathematics profile

Students who wish to explore a variety of Social Science disciplines while pursuing an interest in mathematics might consider the Mathematics profile. This profile increases the number of university programs available. Courses specific to this profile are Differential Calculus, Integral Calculus, Linear Algebra and Vector Geometry.

400.AC Commerce profile

This profile is designed for students interested in the business world, commerce, and economics. It ensures they complete the prerequisites required for university studies in business administration, including Microeconomics and the three mathematics courses. It also includes Introduction to Business. Students who wish to explore non-business fields before beginning university should consider this profile within the Social Science program. Those who want to focus on business studies during their time at CEGEP should consider our three-year P.W. Sims Business program.

Pre-University Double DECs

In addition to our regular programs and profiles, we offer three-year DECs that allow you to combine two programs in one.

Why Complete a Double DEC?

You might choose to complete a Double DEC because:

- You are passionate about more than one field
- You are considering a multidisciplinary program at the university level
- You are interested in having access to a wider variety of program options after CEGEP
- You completed your high school studies in French and want to spend an extra year polishing your English skills
- You want extra time and information to help you choose a career

How Does It Work?

Each Double DEC has an average of fewer courses per semester than its component programs. In addition, students have an extra year (and more courses) to improve their English-language skills. This can be especially beneficial if your previous studies were completed in French.

There are no profiles in a Double DEC. However, you can tailor your choice of upper-level courses to fit your university plans.

Some courses that you will take during your Double DEC will count for both programs. In your last semester, you will complete the comprehensive assessments for each program.

The P.W. Sims Business program in Administration and Management Technology is designed to equip students with a strong foundation in the principles and practices of modern business.

Your Studies

Why should you consider a three-year program?

- Students study business in-depth while at CEGEP, taking more than 20 business-related courses in areas like accounting, marketing, human resources management and international business.
- Graduates have many options upon completing their DEC.
- The practical focus of this program includes classroom use of laptops (required at the start of first year), an information technology course each year, contact with local businesses, as well as two internships - one at the end of second year (for 3 weeks) and one at the end of third year (for 6 weeks).
- Students who would prefer to also study non-business fields before beginning business studies at university should consider the Commerce profile of our Social Science program.

DEC-BAC Agreements

To apply to the P.W. Sims Business program, you must satisfy the college general admission requirements. There are no math prerequisites for entrance into the program.

These courses require TS 5 or SN 5 Math as a prerequisite and are not offered at St. Lawrence.

The DEC Pathway is a transition semester for students who wish to have extra time and help in moving from high school to college studies. The DEC Pathway is not a program itself, but it normally leads to a regular program in your second semester.

However, the DEC Pathway will include some of your required general education courses (English, French, Humanities or Physical Education) and often one or two of the concentration courses for the DEC you wish to eventually complete.

This option may be for you if you would be at greater risk of academic difficulty without the additional time and assistance. It is also available to applicants who need to complete prerequisite high school courses before being admitted to the DEC program of their choice. While St. Lawrence does not offer such courses directly, they may be completed through adult education at the secondary level on a part-time or full-time basis.
